DAID UNION MEETINGS:

Last term, the majority of teachers at our school attended meetings to discuss the nation-wide crisis facing schools. Later this term there are more meetings. One of the main focuses for these meetings is the teacher shortage that is starting to disrupt children's learning. The facts and figures about teacher supply are simple and disturbing:

- Over the past 6 years, there has been a 40% drop-off in those training to teach.
- 40% of new teachers leave the profession in the first 5 years of teaching.
- Meanwhile, 35% of NZ's experienced teachers will be eligible to retire during the next 10 years, and many are leaving early.

At our school, we are lucky to have a full complement of teaching staff, however we are unlikely to remain unaffected if this crisis continues.

Our children deserve the best. However, this can only happen when there is a supply of committed, talented teachers and principals.

Most of our teachers will be attending the next NZEI meeting on the afternoon of Wednesday 27th June. To minimise disruption to the community, we will remain open on this day, but we are offering parents the chance to collect their children at 12.45pm. Otherwise, children will be collected at the normal time of 3pm. A separate letter will be sent home next week for parents to complete.
