

CHOOL UNIFORM:

We have noticed that some children are not wearing the **correct** school uniform. As part of our continuing efforts to improve and maintain our uniform standards, we ask parents to help us maintain a tidy and correct uniform.

- Running shoes are not part of our school uniform.
 Students must wear plain black school shoes, lace up or Velcro, to and from school. Running shoes can be worn at school, but must be brought in a plastic bag and changed into at school.
- Long navy socks are to be worn by boys, and short navy ankle socks or navy tights, by girls. Boys' socks must be pulled up, and if necessary, garters can be worn.
- Coloured T-Shirts or singlets must NOT to be seen under the polo shirts.
- All items of clothing MUST be labelled clearly.

Please remember, NO MEDICINE is allowed to be kept in students' bags. This includes Ventolin inhalers. If your child requires an inhaler at school, it must be handed in at the office, a Medicine Consent Form filled in, and then it will be kept in the school's locked medicine cupboard in the sick bay. At the moment there is a high need for Ventolin as children are training for cross country.


